Important New Services and Changes for 2008–09:

- **DES – Digital Education Services**

If you are looking for your local DELC, you need to look for your DES instead! Our wonderful DELC's that assisted you in accessing instructional resources are now DES. So...when you think DES, think the future! DES personnel for each district will be working with educators in their schools to bring the digital world into their classrooms. Go to www.scetv.org/education/des for information.

- **OnePlaceSC**

With this NEW Web portal, educators will have a single sign on, providing time-saving searches across many quality K–12 educational sites, including all of ETV's Web content, ITV and DISCUS sites. The TV guide feature will show all of ETV's satellite and broadcast programming.

- **IP Transition for 1/3 of Districts**

Instead of broadcast TV, DES centers will have the ability to stream live video and record a minimum of 4 channels, including ITV, ETV, the SC Channel, and local district programming. In one-third of our school districts that have undergone the transition to IP delivery, DES operators can schedule and record educational content much like you would with a digital video recorder.

- **New Channel Designations and Block Feeds**

Due to the upgrade of ETV's delivery system, channel numbers have changed. For example, channel 301 is now called channel 1, channel 302 is now called Channel 2, etc. Most ITV programming will be on channel 1 or 2. ITV block feeds of series that are many programs of longer durations will be facilitated overnight due to limited channel space.

- **More ITV/ETV Programs in StreamlineSC**

Over 1,300 ITV and ETV programs are available online in *StreamlineSC*. These resources are marked with "SL" in the Curriculum Overview sections and in the description sections of the *ITV Link* and online *ITV Resources* book. We continue to add more programs and teacher's guides!

ITV "SPLASH" Week - Limited Rights and Block Feeds

* The new ITV series will be block fed during ITV "SPLASH" week – September 22–26 and this is your opportunity to tape new programs to share with your teachers. Look at the schedule on pages 25–26 of this publication and plan to tape the new series!

* Most ITV series will be block fed several other times during the year. However, **several series now have limited rights for ITV to repeat**, but all of these will be in *StreamlineSC*. These series that can only air once in the fall and once in January or February in the ITV schedule are **Becoming a Better Me, Becoming Successful in Middle School** (old and new lessons), **Exploring Healthy Choices, A History of Women's Achievement in America**, and **20th Century Turning Points in US History**. **Therefore, please pay special attention when we announce broadcasts of these series as ITV cannot repeat them.** Remember, they are in *StreamlineSC*!

* Due to the change with the new scheduling system, block feed schedules will be announced and posted to the ITV web site as soon as possible. Look for information on block feeds in future *ITV Updates* and in special announcements. (Block schedules are not part of the online *ITV Resources* book.)

ITV no longer pays for rights to these programs so it is illegal for you to use your copies unless you arrange for retention rights, which are usually one dollar per minute on a yearly basis. All of the series in the new ITV Link have been cleared for you to use as indicated with the rights statement. If you need clarification on rights, go to page 6 in the online ITV Resources book to find all rights indications. If you have more questions, contact ITV.

If you want to print it, the PDF file is 107 pages long including the covers. The MS Word file only contains the descriptions and schedules, but is convenient if you would like to copy and paste into flyers, etc. Also, the MS Word file is searchable using the "find" feature in MS Word. Wait, don't stop there! Encourage your teachers to create on their desktop a shortcut to the downloaded file. Then after it's downloaded once, the *ITV Resources* book is just a click away and available without having to use the Internet! Idella Bodie's SC Women Series – NEW Programs Soon!

Repeat block feed Sept. 29, 11:30 a.m.–1:36 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

These dramas about South Carolina women are produced by ITV with ETV. They have been adapted with permission and input from author Idella Bodie from her book *South Carolina Women* and are recommended to support social studies standards for elementary and middle grade students. Available in *StreamlineSC* with a supporting teacher's guide that has standards correlations.

Idella Bodie's SC Women series features stories about heroines in our state's history. Each dramatization tells the story of women who have shaped South Carolina history and politics. From the Revolutionary War through modern times, the programs are a testament of the bravery and sacrifices of women who risked their own lives to help our state. Online teacher's guide available.

*Look for new programs about **Mary McLeod Bethune** and **Wil Lou Gray** coming later this year!

Program One - Grace and Rachel Martin – Story of two sisters-in-law living alone in the South Carolina back country who waylaid a British Courier with valuable papers by dressing up as colonial men. They risked their lives to stop the flow of information that could have put Patriots, including their own husbands, in harms way. The drama, taped on location with historical costumes and artifacts, takes place in the cabin considered to be the oldest frontier house still standing in our state.

Program Two - Emily Geiger – Story of a young girl who risks her life by serving as a messenger for the Colonial army during the Revolutionary War. Captured by the British and interrogated as a spy, she managed to trick Lord Rawdon into believing she was innocent, outwitting her captors in a most unique manner. Taped in part at the actual historical location, this drama covers the story of Emily's journey from her assignment with General Greene to her release by Lord Rawdon.

Program Three - Mary Chesnut - Story of a woman who kept a diary during the turbulent times of the Civil War. In this program, segments of her diary come to life as she tells her stories of what happened in our state during this time. Period settings such as the beautiful Kensington Mansion are used along with Civil War re-enactors and authentic costumes.

Program Four - The Grimké Sisters – Story of sisters Sarah and Angelina Grimké, who lived in the 1800's. Both spoke out for what they believed and left their home to fight for the causes of the abolition of slavery and equal rights for women. They helped lead the way to change the course of history both in our state and in the United States.

This series celebrates women's contributions to American history from the 17th century to present day by using archival photos and footage to look at their inspiring accomplishments and victories. From Phillis Wheatley to Maria Mitchell, from Susan B. Anthony to Nellie Bly, from Nancy Lopez to Oprah Winfrey – key women over a 400-year period are featured.

- **20th Century Turning Points**

Grades 7–12 8 lessons/30 mins. (Limited Broadcast/unlimited off-air record, no duplication)

This series is designed to provide a clear overview of the people and events that distinguished the 20th Century at specific points in time. Rare archival footage, photography, authentic recordings, and other primary-source documents bring history to life, while stunning graphics and engaging narration give context and clarity to the subject.

Recommended for elementary students, this series has fact-filled, education content covering social studies, language arts, health, science, math, civics, character education, and environmental issues. There is one program for each day identified by the date that uses music, archival visuals, artwork, photos, and animation to keep the format fast and interesting for young students.

Level 1 *Empathy* focuses the class on kindness, self-control and school behavior. Level 2 *Mediation* is the training component for student leaders using peer mediation. Level 3 *Self Monitoring - Self Control* examines the one-on-one folder system used with identified students needing more intensive feedback. Educators can receive two-hours of recertification (certificate renewal) credit for registering and completing the ITV course SC². (see page 31.)

USB/Thumb Drives: These are portable storage devices that work much like older diskettes did. You can store files on this device (that is no bigger than your thumb) and transport that file to another computer to work on (as long as you have the same software). Great prices on these...4 GB drive from \$15–20.

External Hard Drives: If you are not getting optimum use out of your computer storage you may need some additional storage to store any thing from videos to pics to songs. It's not as portable but it will expand your storage greatly. A good price on this would be around \$100 for a 500GB drive.

Arts Integration Across the High School Curriculum: An Introduction to Arts Integration
Designed for teachers of grades 9–12

Teachers from the South Carolina Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities collaborate on this two-hour recertification course in which examples from Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science classrooms are used to present an introduction to arts integration. The course content progresses from a brief history of arts integration and its rationale through an overview of unique languages of the five areas of the arts (Creative Writing, Dance, Drama, Music and the Visual Arts). Included are suggested resources teachers can use to integrate these five art areas into their classroom from initial arts integration to the fully-infused curriculum. SC² South Carolina - Self Control

This two-hour recertification course entitled *SC² South Carolina - Self Control* developed by Dr. Sue Smith-Rex and produced in cooperation with the State Department of Education's Guidance Services, is designed for elementary teachers, counselors and administrators. The seven programs were produced by ITV with ETV to provide SC schools with an effective way to meet the requirements of the Safe School Climate Act. The SC² model consists of three levels: Empathy (a group lesson for entire class), Mediation (training for student leaders) and Self Monitoring - Self Control (one-on-one folder system for selected students needing more intensive feedback). These levels are outlined in the seven video programs and online packet that guides educators on how to facilitate the model. The Model shows Dr. Sue Smith-Rex working with students in the role of the teacher and guidance counselor in all three levels while utilizing the packet of materials. Dr. Sue Smith-Rex, educator and author, developed the content and serves as instructor. The model was piloted at Geiger Elementary School and they provide feedback/results. School Counseling: Effective Strategies for Program and Personal Success

School Health, Nutrition & Physical Activity-Making It Happen! Series 1

This SCDE Professional Development course was produced as a cooperative effort between the SC Department of Education's Office of Healthy Schools, DHEC Region 3, ITV and ETV. Participants view the programs that were produced in 2006–07 (Series I). Each lesson will contain a "Nutrition 101" segment presented by Dr. Kellie O'Connell from USDA and information on curriculum and web resources. Discussion topics include physical activity, obesity, and nutrition guidelines. Also, successful programs being implemented in schools will be highlighted, providing information on ways schools can incorporate these programs into daily school activities. The lessons are hosted and coordinated by Susan Collier, MS RD, DHEC Chronic Disease Risk Reduction, in collaboration with Lynn Hammond, Director of SCDE's Healthy Schools. All class meetings will take place through distance learning. The video lessons will be accessed online from the ITV Web site at www.itv.myetv.org. The National Endowment for Financial Education (NEFE®) Financial Literacy Workshop

This video course workshop conducted by Suzette Morganelli, Manager of the Financial Counseling and Education Department at the State Credit Union, trains teachers on the implementation of the NEFE's Financial Planning Program to help overcome the literacy problems among our young students. Through this workshop, educators will learn how to effectively teach essential personal finance skills in their classrooms. This course offers a comprehensive, six-unit curriculum providing students with a basic understanding of the responsibilities of successful money management. The curriculum also focuses on important life skills such as the relationship between career and money, the fundamentals of spending and saving, and using credit wisely. All materials, including Student Guides, Instructor's Manuals and DVDs are provided. When payment has been received, course materials and DVDs will be mailed directly to you.

A Gendered Classroom

A new ITV recertification course entitled *A Gendered Classroom* developed by instructor David Chadwell and produced as a cooperative effort between the SC Department of Education's Office, ITV and ETV provides key information about single-gender education, focusing on six differences between boys and girls, the implications in the classroom, and strategies to meet the needs of individual students. Interviews with teachers from single-gender classes are also a part of the videos. Single-gender education is teaching boys and girls the same high standards within different classrooms. Federal regulations issued in October 2006 authorized the use of single-gender classrooms, programs, and schools within districts as a way to meet the educational needs of its students. Currently, there are over 200 schools within South Carolina that offer some form of single-gender program. Single-gender programs exist in elementary, middle, and high schools. All class meetings will take place through distance learning. The video lessons will be accessed online from the ITV Web site at www.itv.myetv.org. The instructor and participants will communicate via Blackboard—the course platform on the Internet.

ARTS

The Arts in Every Classroom – for teachers of grades K–5

Providing new ideas about working with the arts for K-5 classroom teachers and art specialist teachers, this course shows workshop leaders from the Southeast Center for Education in the Arts working with Learner Teams of teachers, principals, and arts specialists from three elementary schools.

Connecting with the Arts: A Workshop for Middle Grades Teachers 6–8

Providing middle school teachers with opportunities to effectively integrate the arts with other subjects, this course demonstrates a variety of approaches for creative learning experiences and various types of curriculum connections. This collaborative approach shows teachers how to plan with colleagues, design instruction, and evaluate student learning.

LANGUAGE ARTS

Teaching Reading: K–2 Workshop

Reviewing critical topics such as current research on reading instruction and how it informs classroom practices, these eight videos demonstrate through observation in real reading classes how to develop the literacy skills of every student. The participants are continuously engaged in utilizing teaching strategies and comprehension skills to improve the reading and writing abilities of their students.

Teaching Reading: 3–5 Workshop

This course affords participants the opportunity to help students progress from "learning to read" to "reading to learn." The videos show literacy experts discussing both current research/techniques for learning to read and how to teach a diverse range of students. These techniques demonstrate actual classroom activities that emphasize such topics as fluency, word study, and assessment. Teachers will find new ideas/techniques to supplement their teaching.

Conversations in Literature, Grades 6–12

In this video workshop, teachers, academics, and authors gather as a "community of readers," immersing themselves in classic and contemporary literature from *Hamlet* to works by Langston Hughes, James Dickey, and Alice Walker. Develop your own reading community using these video programs with coordinated Web site and print guide, and learn how intuition, background experiences, and personal involvement construct meaning for readers. Return to the classroom with inspiration to guide your students toward engaging with literature in the same way.

Engaging with Literature: A Workshop for Teachers, Grades 3–5

Providing participants with opportunities to observe teachers throughout the country demonstrate the techniques and philosophies they use daily, these nine video lessons present activities on how to guide students to become effective readers of literature. To ensure that students make sense of the information they discover, emphasis is placed on their talking, reading, and writing about that information.

In Search of the Novel, Grades 6–12

While it explores fresh approaches to teaching the novel, it also confirms what English teachers know. Readers experience novels in various and individual ways since they bring their own lives to them. The videos feature innovative classroom activities, interviews with contemporary novelists, and ten of the most popular novels on school reading lists.

Inside Writing Communities, Grades 3–5

This workshop for elementary teachers uses classroom footage to demonstrate how a writing workshop approach motivates students and helps them become proficient and independent writers. Six nationally known experts in writing instruction comment on teaching and using the writing workshop approach with upper elementary students.

Making Meaning in Literature: A Workshop for Teachers, Grades 6–8

Providing teachers with opportunities to combine the best of teaching with the best of literature, these nine video lessons examine ways to help students "make meaning." Participants observe creative practices as students shape their writing, reading, and discussion skills. Dr. Judith Langer, a noted educational researcher, promotes building envisionments to help students become effective readers of literature.

Teaching Multicultural Literature: A Workshop for the Middle Grades 6–8

Providing teachers with opportunities to study ethnically diverse American writers, these video lessons explore numerous resources and instructional strategies. Throughout the videos students discuss social justice, class, and race. As students are empowered to take action for change, they become better stewards of their own identities. Leading educators and featured teachers offer commentary and reflection in addition to authors who discuss their lives and works.

Write in the Middle: A Workshop for Middle School Teachers

Providing participants with ways to help students become proficient and confident writers, these eight one-hour videos expose students to effective practices and strategies modeled by excellent teachers. Informed by interviews with nationally recognized writers, students become beneficiaries of a productive and positive writing environment.

SCIENCE

Science in Focus: Shedding Light on Science – for teachers of grades K–5

Providing an opportunity to study the theme of shedding light, this course offers elementary teachers tips for explaining light in Earth science, chemistry, physics, biology, and space science. Because light is an interdisciplinary study topic, it is easy for classroom activities to make meaningful connections to real-world phenomena. Teachers will investigate the behavior and role of light through studies of the seasons, the production of food by plants, and the weather.

Essential Science for Teachers: Earth & Space Science – for teachers of grades K–6

Providing participants with fundamental science concepts, these eight one-hour video lessons show demonstrations, still graphics, animation, and real world examples - all designed to correlate with interviews with educated scientists and children about science class topics. These topics range from soil to the solar system. Opportunities are available for increasing students' science knowledge and observing teachers engaging their students in essential observation and research techniques.

Essential Science for Teachers: Life Science – for teachers of grades K–6

Designed to help teachers enhance their understandings of "big ideas" in the life sciences, this course explores topics that range from the molecules of life to the complexities of an entire ecosystem. Video examples, colorful graphics, lively animations and other demonstrations are used as learning tools to bring meaning to the content addressed.

Essential Science for Teachers: Physical Science – for teachers of grades K-6

These eight videos offer the participant opportunities to gain a better understanding of specific science concepts needed for teaching important standards-based curricula about matter. The participant is engaged in observing activities on animation, "Science Studio" student thinking, classroom demonstrations, and interviews with scientists. Topics range from the essential properties of aluminum foil to the plasma that makes up the Sun.

Science in Focus: Energy – for teachers of grades K–6

Understanding the concept of energy in earth and space science and physical science is crucial for elementary school teachers. In this one-hour course, the eight video lessons demonstrate the role energy plays in machines, motion, food, and the universe. Fascinating activities such as bouncing balls, the swinging of pendulums, photosynthesis through animation, and how to be smart consumers of energy are examples of teaching the concept of energy.

Learning Science Through Inquiry – for teachers of grades K–8

Providing participants with opportunities for using inquiry-based teaching, these eight videos demonstrate teaching/learning strategies in real classrooms with both teachers and students engaged in the process. Each video offers numerous "how to" activities for the veteran teacher as well as the newcomer. One of the many strengths of the program is the connection of the scientific inquiry process with other subject areas.

Science in Focus: Force and Motion – for teachers of grades K–8

This course provides the opportunity to explore science concepts in force and motion, allowing teachers to obtain a better understanding and helping them to engage students in their own explorations. With science and education experts as guides, participants will learn more about gravity, friction, air resistance, magnetism, and tension through activities, discussions, and demonstrations. Emphasis in the lessons is on helping students connect science to real-world phenomena and a variety of classroom footage is utilized.

The Science of Teaching Science – for teachers of grades K–8

Providing K-8 teachers unique opportunities to explore ways to improve their teaching practices, this course directs their attention to real classroom activities in which they observe other teachers in unrehearsed situations. These "user friendly" videos stimulate the veteran teachers to try different teaching approaches and at the same time provide new teachers excellent "how to" activities for classroom implementation.

SOCIAL STUDIES

Social Studies in Action: A Methodology Workshop – for teachers of grades K–5

Providing a methodology framework for teaching social studies focusing on creating effective citizens, this course provides teachers with a stimulating learning experience on ways to connect social studies to the world beyond the classroom. These video lessons, led by Mary A. McFarland, a prominent social studies educator, engage teachers in exploring social studies themes, theories of learning, and teaching strategies through discussions, debates, and activities adapted to a K-5 curriculum.

Teaching Geography - Annenberg/CPB – for teachers of grades 7–12

Offering a strong foundation in geography content along with teaching skills that are outlined in the National Geography Standards, this course answers questions about determining city location, people migration, and places as influences on the spread of disease. Guided by geography experts' commentary, eight video lessons engage teachers in profiling locations around the globe as well as observing a myriad of classroom activities.

The Economics Classroom – for teachers of grades 9–12

Providing a solid foundation for teaching concepts in high school economics courses, this course focuses on a range of topics from personal finance to global economic theories. In addition to defining economics concepts and outlining modern economic theory, the video lessons review the national standards for economics education and provide effective lesson plans and classroom strategies.

Primary Sources: Workshops in American History – for teachers of grades 9–12

Providing high school history teachers the opportunity to explore the use of primary source documents in the research and interpretation of American History, this course presents a fascinating study beginning with pivotal events from the settlement of Jamestown to the Korean conflict and the Cold War.

MATH

Mathematics: What's the Big Idea? – for teachers of grades K–8

This workshop series is based on an approach to teaching and learning that emphasizes students doing mathematics themselves and constructing their own mathematical strategies, rather than following rote recipes that someone else has designed. Much research has shown that students who approach math in this way develop a deeper and more flexible understanding that supports their ongoing mathematical learning. Students learn to describe their strategies to their peers and to prove that their approach is sound.
