Mark your calendar for October 6 when **Project Discovery** host Bette Jamison will be joined by co-host **Rudy Mancke**, ETV's **NatureScene**, for a special LIVE program that takes a look at the science surrounding hurricanes and the impact of Hugo on our state. Produced with ETV by ITV's David Moore, **Project Discovery** is an interactive field trip designed to take SC students to visit interesting places and learn from historians, scientists, naturalists, and others! This special program is a great opportunity for your students to hear from and question the experts.

We plan to learn about the history of this "storm of the century," take a look at storm tracking with a meteorologist, visit the small community of McClellanville that took the direct hit in 1989, and trace the way Hugo changed our South Carolina landscape, impacting plant and animal life.

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips 2009–10

Broadcast on ETV at 1 p.m. and Ch. 1 at 10 a.m. & 1 p.m.

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a compelling learning experience for grades 4–8, using re-enactors to play the roles of historical figures. Congratulations to **Vicki Powell at Varennes Academy of Communications and Technology in Anderson School District 5** for receiving the October CWEFT scholarship!

Now is the time to plan for using all the 2009–10 Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips! Talk to your PTO about sponsoring the programs for next year. SC schools can receive all seven programs for around \$500. Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate. By paying the fee, schools get teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. 2009–10 Broadcast Schedule:

- Oct. 15, 2009 ***Emissaries of Peace*** – During the turbulent era of the French and Indian War, the Cherokee people struggled to preserve their independence. Follow Cherokee leader Ostenaco and Virginian Henry Timberlake on their 1762 journey from Chota (the capital of the Cherokee nation) to Williamsburg and London in search of a lasting peace.
- Nov. 19, 2009 ***A More Perfect Union (premiere)*** – Witness the conflict and compromise that accompanied the ratification of the U.S. Constitution. Join young eighteenth-century observers, unseen by convention delegates, as they travel from state to state tallying the vote. Learn about the ratification process and Americans' growing interest in their fledgling nation's new government.
- Dec. 10, 2009 ***Jamestown Unearthed*** – Take a look at how history is written and reevaluated as new methods of study are introduced. Using the example of Jamestown in 1607, explore the myths and misconceptions of that era: revisit the documents, artifacts and other evidence through archaeology. Learn how every generation sees the evidence in new ways, and how this affects our understanding of the past
- Jan. 14, 2010 ***Westward! (premiere)*** – Explore the story of the early days of American westward expansion. Daniel Boone recounts the exciting experiences and unexpected consequences associated with moving west. Learn about the risks and grueling personal hardships of creating new settlements.
- Feb. 11, 2010 ***The Slave Trade*** – Beginning with the American Revolution, this program explores the U.S. law of 1807 that abolished the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Meet the people who were involved in or influenced by this pivotal legislation: the slaves, plantation owners, slave-ship captains, common seamen, government officials, Navy officers, and anti-slavery activists.
- Mar. 11, 2010 ***The Rights of Youth (premiere)*** – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the eighteenth century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.
- Apr. 22, 2010 ***Treasure Keepers*** – You have seen their work in every museum, but what do conservators really do? Learn how conservators prevent or slow the damage caused by “agents of destruction.” Explore how and why preserving history is important for future generations.

***RIGHTS: SC schools may view with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and erased/destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that get a scholarship through ITV for one program OR pay CWEFT to participate can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.**

Using a variety of media from paint to clay and demonstrating a range of creative approaches, these interesting individuals of diverse cultures are self-taught artists, often referred to as visionary or folk artists. This program was developed by the Folk Artists Foundation, which has its roots in South Carolina. Nutrition Basics: Why Food Matters – Lesson 1, *Nutrition Basics*

This first lesson in **Nutrition Basics: Why Food Matters** is entitled *Nutrition Basics*. Designed for grades 4–12, this series added last school year uses the new food pyramid and focuses on the importance of physical activity for our students. Using animation and an upbeat approach, this lesson provides an overview that will interest students. There are six other lessons in the series, each around 23 minutes in duration. U.S. History Field Trips – Special for October

How the USA Grew: 13 Colonies to 50 States

This series engages 4–8 grade students in the study of our nation's history. They cover some of the most widely taught standards-based topics in elementary and middle school history and geography. Taking students to real locations, the eight programs use graphics, animations, maps, and captions to engage students and make history come to life. ITV will provide a special broadcast of one **U.S. History Field Trips** program each month, September through April. Program is 22 minutes in duration.

Schools can be a vital force in tobacco, alcohol and other drug-use prevention education by helping children understand the nature of drugs and the steps they can take to prevent drug use. Elementary Level Recommendations:

- * **Tick Tock Minutes (SL)** – Block feed of entire series Oct. 7, 9:00–9:50 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades PK–2. The first 15 lessons in this series of 35 lessons focus on health and safety. Lesson 7 is *Drugs...No Way*. See page 70 in the online *ITV Resources* book for a list of all titles in the series.
- * **Life Skills 101** – Block feed of entire series Oct. 7, 9:55–10:52 a.m. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record – no tape duplication)
Designed for grades 2–3. Lesson 3 in this series, *Problems and Choices*, focuses on life skill development for young students. See page 49 in the online *ITV Resources* book for a list of all five titles in the series.
- * **Just for Me** – Lesson 6 airs Oct. 7, 10:55–11:10 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 2–4. Lesson 6 in this series, *I Don't Buy It*, shows how the media may influence a child's personal health behavior. See page 48 in the online *ITV Resources* book for a list of all titles in the series.
- * **Straight Up!** – Block feed of entire series Oct. 7, 11:15 a.m.–1:08 p.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 4–6. These six lessons tell the story of a boy who wants to be accepted by his friends who are tempting him to try drugs and alcohol. Hosted by Lou Gossett, Jr.

Middle/High School Level Recommendations: (SL indicates availability in StreamlineSC.)

- * **Think Twice (SL)** – This lesson airs Oct. 7, 1:10–1:33 p.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 6–12. This realistic program introduces youth to three teenagers who are actually incarcerated in South Carolina's juvenile prisons. These teens offer striking depictions of their loss of freedom, while reliving the events and choices that brought them to life behind bars. Their message: Things may have been different for them had they taken the time to "think twice."
- * **Open Lines** – Lesson 7 airs Oct. 7, 1:38–2:35 p.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 7–12. Lesson 7 in this series, the *Teen Survival Week* program, features teens from around the state talking about diverse subjects such as school safety, dating, dress codes, and the environment. Dr. Glen Walter, an educator and psychologist, hosts the program with teens.
- * **Talking It Over: Teen Issues** – Lesson 2 airs Oct. 7, 2:40–3:12 p.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 7–12. Lesson 2, *Drug Abuse*, provides valuable conversations with a counselor and students on key health and social topics such as drug abuse.
- * **Teen Survival Programs (SL)** – Block Feed Oct 8, 12:30 a.m.–7:24 a.m. and Oct. 9, 12:30–2:54 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 9–12. **Keep It Real; Grave Decisions; SC Youth Gang Documentary; MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime and Consequences; Teens and Booze; DLNETS: College 101: Depression and Suicide; and four DLNETS: Peers Influence Peers** programs show the harsh realities of risk-taking behaviors such as not wearing seat belts, speeding, drinking and driving, and gang life. **MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime, And Consequences** has three parts that are good for grades 4–8 also.

- * **Forgotten Son (SL)** – This lesson airs Oct. 9, 3:50–4:02 a.m. (Unlimited rights)
Designed for grades 4–12. The realities of methamphetamine abuse hit home in this moving program about a teen boy's life turned upside down by his mother's addiction.
NOTE: Teachers should preview before use.

Programs for Students

- **XPress: Safety for Students – Lesson 1, Cyber Safety**

Repeats Oct. 6, 10:30–10:57 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

This program was produced last school year by ITV and features teens who are part of the SC Department of Education's Office of Youth Services Youth Advisory Board. The middle and high school students joined Dr. Glen Walter to talk about the important issue of cyber safety. Recommended for students in grades 6-12. This program can serve as a good discussion "starter" on issues.

- **Wexford Series**

Repeat block feed Oct. 6, 11:00 a.m.–1:03 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

This series of five lessons designed for students in grades 6-10 explores abuse in teenage relationships, bullying, peer pressure, anger and alternatives to aggression and violence, criticism, and striving for perfection. Problems are resolved in a positive manner, ultimately finding workable solutions that are realistic. Each lesson is approximately 23 minutes in duration.

Curriculum and Content Corner...What's new from ITV in *StreamlineSC* and *OnePlaceSC*... with Dianne L. Gregory

September has been busy at ITV as there are now over **1461** of our **ITV** programs available on *StreamlineSC* and *OnePlaceSC*...with more to come. Accessing our **ITV** programming is a smorgasbord of opportunity with a feast of resources. Let's take a tour of some of our new programming on *StreamlineSC*. **The Big Picture**, a series produced by ETV for grades 7–12, features timely topics of interest about our state. Selected programs that will be available through **ITV** include *The Catawba River*, *SC's Military History*, *Drummond: The Senator from Ninety-Six*, *The Orangeburg Massacre*, *Locally Grown*, *H.L. Hunley*, and *Congressman Jim Clyburn*. *South Carolina's First Ladies* provides a special insight into life in the Governor's Mansion with five former First Ladies as they describe the joys and challenges of raising families and representing our state as the wife of the Governor. *Economic Impact of Hurricanes* is certainly timely as we commemorate the twentieth anniversary of Hurricane Hugo. *South Carolina Artists* provides a unique look into the arts community of our state. One of the artists, Laura Spong, shares her experiences through the decades of her career. **All Rendered Truth (A.R.T.)**, geared for grades 5–12, highlights the work of 21 artists working throughout the southeastern United States. Using a variety of media and demonstrating a range of creative approaches, these interesting individuals are self-taught artists, often referred to as visionary or folk artists. This program was developed by the Folk Artists Foundation, which has roots in our state.

Auntie Karen's Place is a new addition to *StreamlineSC* for pre-k through fifth grade. This program was created by the Auntie Karen Foundation partnership with ETV, Palmetto Children's Hospital and the USC School of Music. The focus is on health and life skills using music and puppets to interest young learners. Topics of the program include sickle cell awareness, financial literacy and emergency preparedness. Additionally within **Auntie Karen's Place**, the ten-minute segment addressing the Sickle Cell Disease is also a stand-alone program on *StreamlineSC* entitled **The Jamaican Yams "When Cousin Zetta Comes to Visit": A Sickle Cell Story**. The purpose of this segment is to assist sickle cell patients and providers with tools to prevent a pain crisis, manage a mild pain crisis and provide age appropriate education about the signs of a pain crisis. The program is designed for children living with sickle cell, their families, classmates, teachers and caregivers. This segment uses puppets and music to provide a simple way to explain this complex disease.

For grades 3–12, the **Eye on the Past** series produced by WRJA-TV in Sumter provides short segments on interesting, significant historical people, places and events in our state's history. **Flight School** is a four-part series, which examines historical, scientific and technological aspects of aviation and its impact on exploration, communication and commerce. Each program integrates science, technology, engineering, physics, math, and other fields of study. Produced by the Fairfax Network, this series is also available in *StreamlineSC* for grades 4–8.

EdAware: Eat Smart Move More SC addresses childhood obesity by providing information on healthy eating habits and physical activity for professionals with an accompanying student component.

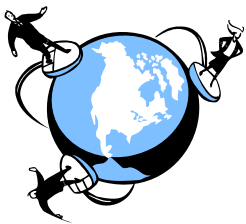
